No single sign alone should cause concern, but a combination of any of the following should be cause for concern and action.

- 1. Direct or verbal threats of harm.
- 2. Intimidation of others by words and/or actions.
- 3. Refusing to follow policy.
- 4. Carrying a concealed weapon or flashing a weapon to test reactions.
- 5. Hypersensitivity or extreme suspiciousness.
- 6. Extreme moral righteousness.
- 7. Inability to take criticism of job performance.
- 8. Holding a grudge, especially against supervisor.
- 9. Often verbalizing hope for something to happen to the 'other' person against whom the individual has the grudge.
- 10. Expression of extreme desperation over recent problems.
- 11. Destruction of property.

Initial handling:

- Declare the situation early
- Use your intuition. Do what is necessary to be safe as the first priority.
- Move to an area where you can place a call,
- Goal is to activate **Code 13 and get HELP or call "911".** If the situation prevents you from calling, if possible request this of another person in the area.

Announce 3 times when possible: CODE 13 with LOCATION

- Move other people/patients out of the immediate area when possible/safe.
- Move the patient/person to a quieter/more isolated location as quickly as possible.
- Minimize the number of people interacting with the patient/person to:
 - o A support person senior manager to observe and coordinate.
- Try not to confine the patient/person more than necessary:
 - o Use a holding room, Keep observation window open. Keep doorway open.
 - Allow patient/person to wander and, if necessary, to leave the building.
 - Attempt to check bag/backpack/jacket for sharps/weapons/drugs.
- If a weapon or hostage is involved follow procedures outlined in the Code Silver (Shooter) by telling the operator about the weapon or hostage.
- Make mental notes or as quickly as possible write out notes to be used to pass on to a supervisor / police

Responding staff:

- 1. All available managers and responders Do not storm the area. Most senior manager assesses and takes command. Additional responders are sent away as soon as situation assessed.
- 2. Approach area with caution.
- 3. Evaluate the environment and subjects involved.
- 4. If necessary initiate or continue the evacuation of staff, patients, and visitors.
- 5. With the assistance of the operator request law enforcement back-up if necessary by dialing 911.
- 6. Document as an incident report

CODE 13 – Threatening Situation – Belligerent/Combative person
